



Number of international migrants by income group of country or area of destination, 2000 to 2015





Percentage distribution of international migrants by region of destination, for regions of origin, 2000 and 2017






Number of international migrants by income group of country or area of origin, 2000 to 2015





Global and tertiary graduated expatriation rate (vertical axis) and level of relative GDP per head (horizontal axis)




Distribution de la population totale et immigrée par classes d'âge en 2017




Evolution of the share of highly-educated among immigrants

Notes: Changes in percentage points, 15- to 64-year-olds, 2006-07 to 2017



Immigration permanente en pourcentage de la population par principales catégories, 2016








Carte 1 : Les étrangers dans la population des zones d'emploi France métropolitaine entre 1968 et 2014








